

YPI PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS



To ensure the YPI program is run seamlessly at all schools, we kindly ask that you take a moment to review the program requirements. As always, YPI will provide year-long support to you and your students, and you are encouraged to reach out at any time for clarity as you move through the project.

- YPI will be taught in all classes of one mandatory course across one chosen grade/year level.
- 100% of all students across the grade level must participate. This is a requirement in order to ensure inclusivity for all students.
- Your school's YPI Lead Teacher will be the main point of contact for YPI communications and will provide updates on your school's YPI project upon request throughout the year.
- YPI will be delivered over the course of at least four weeks (in each class), using/adapting the lessons in the provided YPI curriculum guide.
- Charity site visits or interviews are strongly encouraged. Your school will permit/support students in connecting with their chosen charity.
- Charities are to be identified and selected by students, and must meet the YPI eligibility requirements: registered Canadian charity providing social services directly to people in your local community.
- A Final Assembly will be arranged in each school to permit finalist teams from each class to give their presentation to an audience and a panel of judges.
- The judging panel must be made up of a majority of students, with some teachers or administrators.
