

Student-led philanthropy driving change in Canadian communities

These are challenging times. Never have we experienced such disruption in our daily lives caused by the global pandemic. Today's youth are among the most resilient, but also among the hardest hit as they navigate a world in which their education and their engagement in their local communities are facing major disruptions.

Now more than ever, investing in our youth is paramount. The demand for year-round services – from housing, to food security, to providing mental health support – has significantly increased. Meanwhile, donations have dramatically decreased.

Youth & Philanthropy Initiative (YPI) Canada was founded in 2002 by the Toskan Casale Foundation, a multi-generation family foundation committed to providing near-term relief to at-risk people while building values of compassion and empathy. The organization's values are rooted in the founders' experience with MAC Cosmetics and the MAC AIDS Fund.

At YPI Canada, we see the impact young people can make as champions for social issues and community leadership. Over the past two decades, YPI Canada has granted close to \$11 million to community-based social service charities, selected by thousands of high school students through a unique student-driven, school-based curriculum.

Born out of a simple idea when it was first piloted in Toronto at Royal St. George's College, YPI's mission and mandate are now more relevant than ever before. Grade nine and ten students select and study their chosen charities and non-profit organizations. They then present their knowledge and findings to their teachers and classmates, who collectively decide which organization should receive a YPI grant. As one Grade 10 participant shared with us, "I honestly think young people are often left out of philanthropy because adults think we'll mismanage money and organize it in the wrong places. It's important to change this because

everything will be in our hands in the future. Beginning the process of philanthropy earlier plants a seed to continue this work after we graduate, and well into the years ahead.”

Today, despite restrictions brought on by the pandemic, YPI continues to deliver the program in collaboration with educators in over 100 schools in 8 provinces.

Through this program, students are challenging stigmas, changing behaviours, and developing leadership and philanthropy skills as they direct grants and critical public funding support for millions of people in need across Canada. Students develop a deep and personal understanding of the real issues facing their communities.

Connecting people is the central tenet guiding all of YPI's actions as this is fundamental to building compassionate communities. As such, YPI Canada's impact is made possible only by growing a community of youth, teachers, charities, and funders working together.

While the short-term impact of the grants in communities is

significant, it is the experience for Canada's youth that will have the greatest long-term impact on philanthropy. The program has clearly shown that young people are caring and capable of being meaningfully involved in addressing often complex social issues. When we trust and empower them, they become leaders now and for the future.

“The students inspire us to continue to grow more compassionate communities,” says YPI's founder Julie Toskan. “YPI's twentieth anniversary offers an opportunity to look to the future beyond the pandemic. We are challenging ourselves to not only meet the ambitious goals for 2024 in YPI's five-year strategic plan but to exceed them given the urgency to support charities and the communities they serve.”

1 LAUNCH
Students are introduced to YPI.

2 TEAMS
Teams identify social issues affecting their communities.

3 RESEARCH
Students research local charities addressing their chosen social issue.

4 SELECTION
Students choose the charity they believe best addresses their cause.

5 CONTACT
Students deepen their knowledge of the charity.

6 PRESENTATION
Students deliver a presentation on the charity and the impact of a grant.

7 FINALS
Finalists present to their school and judges. The best case receives the \$5,000 for their charity.
